A STATEMENT BY THE CLASS OF 1970

In light of the uncertainties and the strong feelings aroused by events of the past two weeks, the Class of 1970 finds it appropriate to affirm its desires on the subject of Commencement Weekend.

We are acutely aware that our Commencement will be taking place in a time of extraordinary tension. Events of the past two weeks in national politics, at Oberlin College, and in the City of Oberlin have been a source of intense emotional involvement as well as the cause of extensive political activity for many of us. The Class wishes to strongly encourage the efforts of the Commencement Concerns Committee and of those other groups and individuals who will be taking positive political action during the four days of Commencement Weekend.

There are two Commencement events which are necessarily the concern of the entire Class -- the Baccalaureate service and the Commencement exercise itself. Both these ceremonies are tightly programmed in their present forms and both stand to lose a great deal of their impact should they be extensively lengthened. The Baccalaureate service is structured around an address by Professor Swearer; the Commencement is structured around an address by the Reverend Jesse Jackson.

With these considerations in mind, the Class of 1970 adopts the following resolutions on the subject of Baccalaureate and Commencement:

(Five of the resolutions adopted by the Class concerned processions, music, welcoming remarks by the class president, a suggestion for the Benediction, and specific guidelines for dress. The suggestions contained in these resolutions have been incorporated into the Baccalaureate and Commencement ceremonies. The two additional resolutions which were adopted appear below.)

Because Commencement is an important symbolic event for many seniors, and, even more, for the parents and families of many seniors, there should be basic uniformity of dress among those receiving diplomas in the Commencement ceremony.

Parents and guests are invited to participate in a silent vigil on Tappan Square from 8:15 to 8:30 a.m. on the day of Commencement.

This statement was adopted by vote of the Class of 1970 on May 14, 1970.
